Susumu Kinoshita

1947 : Born in Toyama city, Toyama Prefecture, Japan

1961: Had the opportunity to make his first sculpture during the summer vacation, and his talents were noticed by his art teacher who introduced him to Naohira Otaki, a sculptor at the University of Toyama. Attended a course for the general public taught by Otaki. Meet Yoshi Kinouchi, a sculptor living in Tokyo, through Otaki.

1964: Met Saburo Aso, a Western-style painter, through Yoshi Kinouchi.

His crayon drawing 'Tatsu (Standing)' was selected for an exhibition by the Jiyu Bijutsu Association at the Tokyo Metropolitan Art Museum.

1965: Left school in the second year of enrolment at the Department of Food and Chemical Industry, Toyama Prefectural Women's and Agriculture High School (Present: Toyama Nishi High School) to work at a place that makes signboards

He was again selected for the Jizan Artists Association Exhibition at the Tokyo Metropolitan Museum of Art with his oil painting "Playing Carta".

Around this time, he had the opportunity to meet the painter, Masao Tsuruoka, a member of the Jiyu Bijutsu Association.

His wife's family opposed his marriage, and he ran away from Toyama to Niigata.

1973: Visited Europe It was a pilgrimage where he received enormous influence from the works of Van Gogh, Rembrandt, Michelangelo, Da Vinci, etc.

1977 Moved to Kawaguchi City, Saitama Prefecture

1981: First visit to the U.S. where he attempt to present his works, but failed

Met Arakawa Shusaku at a party held at Kawashima Takeshi's atelier in Soho, New York After returning to Japan, he was invited by Sunouchi Toru, an art critic, to Ishimizu-tei in Sasakami Village, Niigata Prefecture. He missed the bus that will take his back to Tokyo, and happened to hear the singing of Kobayashi Haru, a female blind singer, which impacted him significantly.

This encounter with Koabayashi Haru, at a point where he was feeling despondent about his unsuccessful attempts in the U.S. and in the process of exploring pencil drawings to establish his originality, resulted in him seriously considering reorientating himself as a pencil artist.
